What is Gift Aid?

Gift Aid is a Government Scheme, administered by the HM Revenue and Customs Department, which enables charities to reclaim the basic rate tax you have paid as a tax payer – an extra 28p for every £1 of the total paid.

Who is eligible to give The Palace Trust permission to claim Gift Aid?

Everyone is welcome to give donations to The Palace Trust and as a charity, the Trust relies on support from a wide range of sources including season ticket sales, grants, and donations to carry out its work.

However, only UK taxpayers can fill in the Gift Aid declaration forms, which enable us to make the claim from the Government.

What is a Gift Aid declaration form?

This is confirmation that the person making the payment pays income tax or capital gains tax in the UK, at least equal to the amount claimed back in the appropriate tax year.

If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief on your self assessment tax form.

When can Gift Aid be claimed by The Palace Trust?

Gift aid can be claimed on any donations, season ticket and on admission charges, providing certain conditions apply.

Why is The Palace Trust asking for donations on top of the admission fee to The Bishop's Palace and Gardens?

The rules governing Gift Aid on admissions to charitable attractions, like The Bishop's Palace and Gardens, changed from 6 April 2006. The Government's new scheme state that charities can only claim Gift Aid on daily admission tickets, if visitors who are UK tax payers give a voluntary donation of at least 10% more than the standard admission fee.

For example, if the Gift Aid admission price is £5.00, The Palace Trust can raise an extra £2.04 (from the additional 50p donation, included in the price and £1.54 claimed from the Government, based on 28p for every £1 paid).
